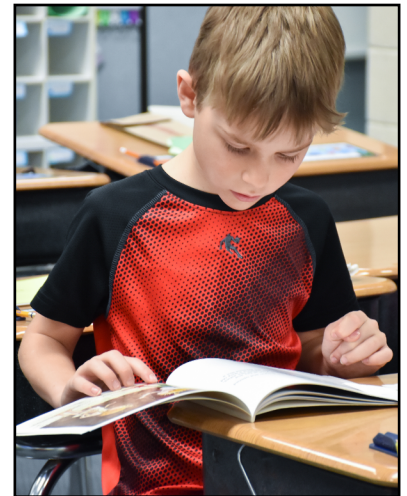
2020 Learning Plans

The Mukwonago Area School District is dedicated to ensuring that high quality student learning will continue during the 2020-21 school year. The district is focused on creating instructional plans that will continue the outstanding education offered in MASD, giving families options to maintain exceptional education, and developing mitigation measures that reduce the risk of transmitting COVID-19 in our schools so we can begin and continue in-person instruction.

Kindergarten - Grade 6 In-Person Learning:

- Regular district curricula and assessments will continue to be used
- Students will be physically distanced to the greatest extent possible
- Students and staff will wear masks or face shields when distancing is not possible
- All special area classes like physical education, art, and music will continue to be offered with increased sanitizing taking place in between classes and schedule changes to minimize the unique number of contacts students and staff have
- Classes utilizing hands-on materials or shared equipment will have additional sanitizing and safety measures in place



Kindergarten - Grade 6 Virtual Learning Option

- Regular district curricula and assessments be used and aligned to in-person learning
- Live instruction in literacy, math, social studies, and science
- Instruction also offered in music, art, physical education, and social/emotional learning
- All K-6 students will be taught by MASD teachers
- Classroom instruction scheduled at designated times of the day where students will be required to attend
- Additional individual support offered to students as needed
- Students will continue to have access to pupil services staff and can participate in extracurricular activities
- Students will be provided a Chromebook to support their virtual learning
- Wifi hotspots will be provided to families in need who select the virtual learning option



Grade 7-12 In-Person Learning:

- Regular district curricula and assessment will continue to be used with additional emphasis early in the year on evaluating students and closing gaps caused by the pandemic in spring
- Students will be physically distanced to the greatest extent possible
- Students and staff will wear masks or face shields when distancing is not possible
- Classes utilizing hands-on materials or shared equipment will have additional sanitizing and safety measures in place
- Schedules will be modified to reduce transition times between classes

Grade 7-12 Virtual Learning Option

- For most classes, students will learn using the Apex Learning platform with standards aligned to our regular curriculum
- With support from MASD teachers, students will complete Apex Learning curriculum independently
- Teachers will establish regular check-in times to meet virtually with students ensuring that progress is being made
- In addition, teachers will have frequent availability to provide instruction and support for students outside their check-in times
- Students will continue to have access to pupil services staff and can participate in extracurricular activities
- For electives not offered in Apex Learning, students can opt to attend the electives in person or they may have the opportunity to participate in a real-time class via live video. Some electives might not be offered via virtual learning
- Students will be provided a Chromebook to support their virtual learning
- Wifi hotspots will be provided to families in need who select the virtual learning option

To enroll in our Virtual Learning Option for the 2020-21 school year, parents must select the option in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal by completing their Annual Update by **August 10**. Families who do not select the virtual learning option will automatically be enrolled into their regular schools.
