## 7TH/8TH GRADE - MEDICAL DETECTIVES - MTZS. PEASE

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Medical Detectives is an elective 9-week course for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. In Medical Detectives, students play the role of real-life medical detectives as they collect and analyze medical data to diagnose disease. They solve medical mysteries through hands-on projects and labs, measure and interpret vital signs, dissect a sheep brain, investigate disease outbreaks, and explore how a breakdown within the human body can lead to dysfunction.

**Infinite Campus -** Infinite Campus is an online grading program that allows parents and students the opportunity to check student progress <u>at any time</u>. When viewing student science scores, the following information will be helpful:

- Missing = the work was never turned in and is calculated as a zero. Any work that is not handed in on-time is marked as missing, regardless of the reason. Once the work is turned in, the zero will change to a grade. If the work doesn't get turned in within the district allotted time frame, the zero stands.
- <u>Late</u> = the work was turned in late.

Please note: The district allows teacher approximately 2 weeks to enter grades. If you handed in work **late** for whatever reason, it may not be entered on the day you handed it in. It will get entered in a timely fashion, but it may not be instantaneous!

**BYOD** – **Bring Your Own Devices** -Students may use their own personal electronic devices **as directed by the teacher**. If the device is not needed in class - it **MUST** be silenced and out of sight! Students should adhere to all MASD guidelines regarding the use of BYOD in school.
