[Filing a DPI Complaint](#): Any individual or organization may file a complaint with the Department of Public Instruction if they believe a public agency has violated state or federal requirements under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) when providing special education programs. <http://www.dpi.wi.gov/sped/complain.html>

[Due Process](#): Either the parent/adult student or the school district has the right to request a due process hearing whenever there is a dispute between the parent and the school district over the district's proposal or refusal to initiate or change the identification, evaluation, proposed IEP or portion thereof, the implementation of the IEP, educational placement, or the provision of a free appropriate public education (FAPE). <http://www.dpi.wi.gov/sped/dueproc.html>
